Mansfield has done very well again with three students shortlisted – Rosanna Sains, Simran Assan and Sonja Roethlisberger – a fantastic achievement!

Rosanna Sains was an excellence award winner and will have her work displayed at GOMA in 2014. Rosanna has won numerous art awards over the years.
